1.0 Meeting with Governor

I visited the Segregation Unit, which contained 2 prisoners, 1 juvenile and 1 young offender both on GOOD. The young offender looked closer to 30 than he did to 20

We discussed performance issues including the weighted scorecard. As to the latter the governor was disappointed that for the loss of 13 points the prison had dropped 26 places. We did note however that when you analyse the data Feltham is still shown as a prison, which is improving its own performance. We discussed KPTs and in particular PPM, R/C, time unlocked and resettlement. The governor provided me with some documentation on the issue of resettlement, which appears to be causing difficulties across London. I agreed that I would get Neil and Jason in the area office to consider this matter further.
